Totara Block Opening Friday 15 August

Last Friday we had a lovely ceremony to signify the opening and completion of Totara Block. Our Year 6 students were heavily involved and once again did us proud – speaking confidently and hosting our guests with pride. I would like to thank the Year 6 parents for supplying us with a beautiful afternoon tea which was enjoyed by all and I would also like to thank Miss Henry, Mrs Neels, Mrs Gore, Mrs Bishop, Mrs Watkin and Mrs Williamson who all contributed hugely to make the afternoon a success. It was disappointing that we did not have more school parents able to be with us to celebrate what is a milestone event for our school. The building of these two classrooms have been a long time in the making but they are here just in time to cope with the growth we are currently experiencing and which will continue to come. When the school opened in 2009, we estimated that we would need more classrooms in 5-6 years, and so it has proven to be. However, I suspect that growth in the next phase will be faster than that. The Ministry of Education has commissioned a consultant to investigate growth in our area and the consultation for this process is already underway. Part of that work will involve examination of proposed housing developments and demographic information and predications based on last year's census. It will be interesting to see what the report will predict for us and the immediate area.

Investing in Educational Success

You may have heard about this proposal in the media, and the news yesterday that members of NZEI (the primary teachers' union) voted to oppose this and not to engage with the government about it through the wage bargaining process. This proposed policy has given us much to think about and discuss in recent months and provided us with a dilemma. On the one hand, no one I know in the education sector is opposed to the ideas of collaboration and sharing of expertise that underpin the policy, but most of us are very concerned about the details of how the government has proposed this will be implemented and the time that it will involve for our teachers and ourselves. Our Board of Trustees has discussed it at length, and we agree that it would be detrimental to our school to have our best teachers away from their classes for up to the equivalent of two days per week. We do not believe most parents would support that. We also believe that it would be detrimental to the quality of what the system can deliver to ask teachers and principals to continue to be experts in their own classrooms and schools while at the same time taking on responsibility for mentoring and supervising professionals in up to ten other schools, even if they are paid for it. The current wage bargaining round is instrumental to the Government being able to implement this, because the Collective Agreement will be the tool to establish the new positions they want to create. It is unclear what will happen now that NZEI members have voted to oppose this.
