**From the Principal** 

Kia ora, Talofa, Kia Orana, Mauri and Greetings to school families

#### **After School Activities**

I have been aware that since SKIDS pulled out of the school last year, many families have been looking for replacement after school activities for their children. I am very pleased to announce that we will be starting a new initiative from Monday 26 May (next week), in association with Tony Mordaunt and *Make a Difference Through Sport*. Tony is our Kiwisport Coach and he has been working with the students every Friday for the last two years, developing the skill base of both students and teachers. He knows the children and we have complete faith in his ability to work with them through sport. It has been one of our goals since we opened the school to develop and run an after school Homework Club, to assist students to complete homework and take the stress of this away from parents. The purpose of homework is to reinforce the work done in class through practice and to ensure that students get enough 'mileage' in their work, so that concepts and aspects taught are cemented in place. This is particularly important in reading, writing and maths.

So, we are bringing these two concepts together, through the generosity of both Tony and the Senior Leadership Team of the school, to offer a service after school on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays that will allow homework to be completed and the children to engage in some healthy activity from 3-5pm.

#### How will it work?

**At 3pm**, children intending to come to Homework Club will have 15 minutes to get their things organized, go to the bathroom, have something to eat and report to the library.

**From 3.15pm – 3.45pm**, a member of the senior leadership team (Mrs Gore, Mrs Bradshaw, Mr Morley, Mrs Neels and I) will supervise Homework Club in the Library. Any child of any age is welcome to attend. If they are intending to move on to sports following this, this means that homework will be completed and they will not need to sit down and do it later in the evening when they get home. This part of the afternoon is provided free of charge.

**From 3.45pm – 5.00pm**, Mr Mordaunt will run the sports sessions – either outside or, if wet, in the hall. Mondays will be soccer, Wednesday will focus on winter tennis and badminton and Friday will be a fun games day. There is a charge for these sessions of \$10 per child per session, payable to Tony or Michelle on the day. You do not need to pre-book. Payments can be made online by arrangement.

# Who can attend?

Children of any age can attend both Homework Club and the sports activities.

Children who attend Homework Club do not need to carry on to sports activities afterwards if they don't want to. They can be collected at 3.45pm or walk/bike home after that.

However, any child remaining at school at 3.15pm, waiting for sports to start at 3.45pm, will be required to attend Homework Club for reasons of safety and supervision within the school grounds.

Please see the separate flier coming home today, or call us if you have questions. Children can attend either session or BOTH.

In addition to the above, we currently have **Hockey** practice occurring on **Tuesday** afternoon, **Singing** lessons with Lou Lou on **Wednesday** afternoon and **Netball** practice on **Thursday** afternoon.

We are developing therefore a number of activities on site that can occupy students in healthy activity from Monday – Friday, and we hope that this will be of some assistance to parents wanting to opt in to some acceptable after school activities on our own doorstep.

#### **SNELLS BEACH SCHOOL VISION STREAMS & Annual Plan 2014**

Our priority areas for 2014 from our 8 point Vision Stream Plan (published in the last newsletter) are:

- 1. Living & Aligning Our Core Values; and
- 2. Grow 'Know Your Learner'

# **Living & Aligning Our Core Values**

As a part of the development of the Vision in 2012, the staff developed a set of core professional values for working together as a team. These are:

- We will live our lives with integrity;
- We will look our best, be our best, do our best;
- We will face each day with courage and happiness;
- We will all look after each other;
- We will value kindness and show respect to everyone.

As you will be aware, we are also a Living Values School and this has been a core platform of our operation since we opened in 2009. The 12 Living Values are very strong and very alive in the school. The children live them and understand them and they form a core part of our school culture and behaviour management plan. We believe these values to be very universal and we want to continue to keep them alive in our school, because we know they are very valuable.

In addition, we have worked closely with our iwi, Ngati Wai, over the past year to understand and enact the key principals of Ngati Wai's Te Kauhua project – ako, manaakitanga, tuakana-teina, awhi and kaitiaki.

Our work in this inquiry is to align all three of these aspects, unpack them and make decisions about how they will be enacted throughout the school to strengthen what we do.

#### **Grow 'Know Your Learner'**

This exciting piece of work is driven by the belief in our vision that we will provide a holistic education, developing the whole child and meeting their individual needs. We need to know and understand ALL children as individuals; what they enjoy and are passionate about, what they struggle with, how they learn best and how we can help them to reach their potential. During this inquiry we are exploring teaching and learning from a number of perspectives – Maori, Pasifika, understanding how the brain works, different learning styles and how we can adapt our approaches for different children.

Throughout the year, teachers will work together to explore these ideas and seek out professional development that develops knowledge which we can bring into the school. As we explore this further, we are discovering all sorts of aspects that help us learn more about our students and tailor what we do to suit them.

#### **Options Programme 2014**

Students in Years 3-6 (the middle and senior schools) will have the opportunity on Friday afternoons to work in an area of the arts – visual art or performing arts - to extend their interest and skill in these areas. A large group of children are practising for J Rock, and a number have put their hands up to be in the choir. In addition, teachers are taking a range of visual art options with small groups of children.

# **Arbor Day**


Our new school project is to plant a 'bird corridor' connecting the Louise Philips garden to the Foundation garden.
