School Survey 2014

Thank you to everyone who completed the school survey at the end of last year. We want to capture how you feel about the school so this information is really important and we do appreciate your feedback.

We are delighted that you continue to feel happy overall with Snells Beach School, our culture and environment. The survey comments indicated that you are finding the new reporting system better. You are also happy with the middle school and senior school swimming programmes. Many of you felt it would be good to have a school pool, we agree! However the Ministry of Education do not provide any funding for school pools so unfortunately this is not something that we can see happening for our school. A few people wondered about the junior swimming programme. The curriculum requires that school provide water confidence for the juniors, not swimming lessons, and currently there are no pool facilities available in the local area that are suitable for 5 and 6 year olds, hence our trips to the beach.

We have included in this year's budget the cost for the change away from hand sanitizer, which was commented on in last year's survey.

We are making positive progress with how we communicate with you, but there is still room for improvement. Good communication with parents of Snells Beach School is what the Board would like to focus strongly on this year.

A copy of the school survey results will be posted on the school website for you to view. There will be a few paper copies in the office also. Once again thank you for your input.

Change of Board Chair & Deputy Chair

Mr Maarten Kleyn has resigned his position after amazing service as Board Chair for more than 3 years. Maarten was elected to the position in March 2012, following the resignation of Don Scandrett and he has been an excellent governor and trustee of our school in this role since then. Over that time there have been celebrations and hardships to work through and in all situations he remained calm and considered with a sensible head and hand on the situation.
