The construction programme is expected to take 17 weeks from commencement and we expect to have the new classrooms commissioned for use at the start of Term 2, 2014.

Security Fencing:

- Security fencing will be erected on Monday 18 November.
- There will be no access from the Foster Cres gate up to the garage i.e. no DIRECT thoroughfare through the school via the teachers' driveway to the Foster Cres gate. The Foster Cres entrance itself will still be operational.
- Fencing will be erected around the building site and entry to this area is prohibited without permission. All visitors must report to the site office.

Parents – please ensure that your children and other family members are aware that this is a building site and is out of bounds at the weekend as well as during the week.

Bike Racks:

• These have been temporarily relocated to the end of the pathway on the western side of the school behind Kauri Block and will remain there until the building is complete. Riders must dismount at the gates and wheel their bikes or scooters to the racks.

Playgrounds and Playing Spaces:

- The senior adventure playground will be de-commissioned during the build and will not be used.
- The Junior Playground will be rostered for use by the whole school.
- Other arrangements are being made to extend the playing areas for students to compensate for the loss of the grassed area in front to Nikau Block.

Staff Car Park and Driveway Access:

- During the build there will be heavy trucks using the staff entrance to the school.
- Site traffic will be restricted from 8.30am 9.15am and 2.30pm 3.30pm for safety reasons.
- No parents' cars are permitted in the staff car park at any time.

Parents – please take extra care in the mornings and afternoons when entering and leaving school grounds across this driveway.

For any queries or concerns about safety during the building programme, please contact the principal immediately via the school office.

We look forward to your patience and co-operation during the build, as there will be some disruption in and around the school. Thank you.
