From the Principal Kia ora, Talofa, Mauri and Greetings to school families

Welcome back to school for the last term of the year! It is so nice to see the sun again and to feel that we are free at last of the winter flu bugs.

Tattybogle fever is upon us as we get close to our performances next Wednesday and Thursday. We are so proud of the children for their efforts as the whole event has been largely driven by and produced by them. We 'bought in' a pre-written play this time, as we have never done this before and it is a genre of production that is worthwhile experiencing. The themes and the subject matter – a scarecrow who can't scare things away – fits well with our school themes and values. All the students have had to learn about the characters and animals in the show and all have had a role in one way or another determining how it will be staged, what the costumes and makeup will look like, what stage settings and props we will use, how the music will sound, what the dance routines will be, what sound and lighting effects to use, the programme & ticket design and how to market the show, depending on what stream of work they have chosen to be in. It has taken a huge amount of organisation and hard work from the students and the teachers as every afternoon for Term 2 we have worked on this, with all middle school and senior school students mixed up in vertical groups, working on their particular strands. They have learned a great deal about the enterprise of putting on a show. Mrs Neels and I as the directors are very pleased with how it has all come together, and we hope you will be too.

Thank you to all those parents who have got into the spirit by assisting children with scarecrow building over the holidays! They look fantastic!

I have some good news at last about our new classroom build. The Ministry of Education has finally approved the additional funding required to build the two new rooms. This has been a long and drawn out process, as they initially approved the build and gave the go ahead for it over a year ago. Unfortunately they did not make enough of a budget allocation for it and this and a few other glitches in the tender process have meant a considerable delay in getting underway. Building consent has now been issued by Council as well, so we are finally good to go! Once we do, there will be some restrictions on use of our site and grounds and we will issue this in a safety plan for you closer to the time.


LIFE EDUCATION PROGRAMME

MANAWA 1 SWIMMING

This term, the swimming programme begins for Manawa One and will be held at the Mahurangi College pool on Thursdays, Week 2 – Week 5 (Oct 24th, Oct 31st, Nov 7th, Nov 14th).

Our swimming programme is being partially sponsored by Aquakidz Swim School. This fantastic opportunity will allow the children to be taught by trained swimming instructors in smaller sized groups than in past years. Aquakidz will also provide equipment designed to maximise safety and skills practise, such as platforms for the less confident swimmers.

This is done at an exclusive rate to the value of \$30.40 per child. <u>Please note:</u> This is the total cost per child even if your child is absent from a lesson. Please make sure your child brings their named swimming gear in a plastic bag or similar. It would be very beneficial for your child/children to have goggles as well.
