School Events

Yr5/6 BEACH EDUCATION DAY OMAHA BEACH SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB

Monday 24 February

This is a unique opportunity for our students to experience a fun, safe and educational day at the beach. The Beach Ed programme is delivered by qualified instructors in an environment that sees the children taught Beach Awareness and Safety through a combination of theory and practical participation modules.

The programme teaches children how to identify hazards and manage their risks accordingly. The activities include:

- Beach Safety
- Sun Smart Practices
- How to recognise dangers at the beach and water activities



The Day's Programme:

We will leave school straight after roll call (approximately 9:10am) and leave Omaha at 2:30pm to return to school before 3:00pm. The day will be broken into three main components: Theory, Beach Activities and Water Activities.

Students will need:

- Mufti clothing for the day
- Togs, rash shirts (wet suits are recommended)
- Two towels
- Plastic bag

- Warm sweatshirt (or school polar fleece)
- Sunblock SPF 30+
- Sunhat (recommend wide-brimmed)
- Morning tea, lunch, water bottle
- Medication required eg: inhalers



YR3/4 SWIMMING AT MAHURANGI COLLEGE POOL

Thursday afternoons, Week 4 – Week 9 (Feb 27th – April 3rd).

Our swimming programme is being partially sponsored by Aquakidz Swim School. This fantastic opportunity allows the children to be taught by trained swimming instructors. Aquakidz will also provide equipment designed to maximise safety and skills practise, such as platforms for the less confident swimmers. Thanks to their support, the cost per lesson for your child is less than the price of a usual lesson.

We will be using a bus to transport the children in order to take the pressure off parents and to spread the cost of transport across all families. The total cost is \$57 for the 6 lessons; this includes pool hire, trained swimming instructors and bus transport.
