From the Principal

Kia ora, Talofa, Mauri and Greetings to school families

Kia ora, Talofa, Kia orana and greetings to our school families

It is the time of the year when we are required to submit our achievement data to the Ministry of Education for the previous year – i.e. 2013. This data is our overall assessment of achievement in relation to National Standards and the Ministry uses this to assess how we are performing in relation to other schools of similar size and decile. The information is published on the Education Counts Website and the media use this to construct league tables of schools. This year we have a scheduled visit from the Education Review Office (ERO) in the first week of April. For the first time, they too will use this data from the website to assess our performance.

There is great debate and a whole lot of discussion to be had about whether this data is robust enough to be used in this way and whether the standards on which it is based are a precise enough instrument to be using. That is a continuing discussion we are having in the education sector. However whether we like it or not, and whether it can be justified or not in assessment or in educational terms, this is the current environment we operate in.

So, what does our data look like? Here is a table that shows you the overall distribution of our students in reading, writing and mathematics in relation to National Standards:

We hope you enjoy your time at our School **Total Roll 210**

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You will see from this that our areas of strength are reading and writing, where we have 74% of all students (reading) and 87% of all students (writing) achieving at or above the National Standards expected levels. We celebrate these results and believe they are a result of concentrated focus on literacy over the last couple of years and the hard work of teachers to lift our levels.

The maths data is not quite as positive, and this is an area that we will be focusing on in 2013 as a result.

As a staff we analyse this information carefully down to the level of every individual child and we do that at the end of each year so that we can incorporate it into our planning for the New Year. Even though our reading and writing results are very good, there are still pockets of underachievement and groups of students that we wish to target. We are required to set targets for the New Year based on this information, and for 2014 our targets are as follows:

2014 Targets:

Age 5-6 Literacy Targets

- a. 100% of students will be in the 52-54 score range for Letter ID
- b. 100% of students will be in the 30-35 score range for Hearing Sounds
- c. 80% of students will be in the 18-24 score range for Concepts About
- 80% of students will be in the 14-15 score range for the Word Test
- 80% of students will be in the 14-15 score range for the Word Test
- 80% of students will be in the 30+ score range for Writing Vocabulary

Cohort Targets for Reading:

- a. Accelerate the progress of the Y2 cohort 2013 to the standard.
- Accelerate the progress of the Y1 cohort 2013 and ensure that progress is accelerated to the standard in 2014.
- c. Accelerate reading progress in the first year of school for the Y1 2014 cohort (reference to Age 5-6 Comparison targets above).

Writing Target:

Accelerate progress for Pasifika students in writing

Mathematics Targets:

- a. Accelerate achievement for the 'After 1 Year' 2013 cohort (Y2 2014), moving those from 'below' to 'at' and 'well below' to 'below'
- Accelerate achievement for the Y5 2013 (Y6 2014) cohort, moving those from 'below' to 'at' and 'well below' to 'below'
